

# Local Rule for Sensitive Garden Areas (No play Zones)

## Hole 1

If you drive your ball left from the tee into the sensitive garden area, this is a no play zone and free relief is allowed.

Nearest point of relief is where the ball entered the garden area and your stance and ball are clear of the garden area. This is the reference point.

Free relief is allowed within one club length of the reference point, no nearer the hole and can be on the teeing area. However the ball cannot be teed.

## Hole 2

If you drive your ball into the sensitive garden area in front of teeing area (playing from back raised tee beside dam), this is a no play zone.

There are 3 options.

### **Option 1**

Nearest point of relief is where the ball entered the garden area and your stance and ball are clear of the garden area. This is the reference point.

Free relief is allowed within one club length of the reference point, no nearer the hole.

This shot is unreasonable for most to play as the ball is not teed and is below the raised teeing area.

### **Option 2**

Take one penalty stroke and return to back markers. Ball can be teed.

### **Option 3**

ILGC Rule - If you do not wish to drive again from the back markers, for one penalty stroke ball can be played from in front of sensitive garden area. However the ball cannot be teed.

Nearest point of relief is where your stance and ball are clear of the garden area. This is the reference point.

Relief is allowed within two club lengths forward of the reference point. This is the only scenario where relief is taken closer to the hole.

## Hole 14

Tan bark to the left of the tee and machinery area to the right of the tee are no play zones and free relief is allowed.

Nearest point of relief is where the ball entered the no play zone and your stance and ball are clear of the no play zone. This is the reference point.

Free relief is allowed within one club length of the reference point, no nearer the hole and can be on the teeing area. However the ball cannot be teed.
